



Best Practice 1

1. Title of the Practice

Inter Departmental PowerPoint Presentation Contest

2. The context that required the initiation of the practice

In order to make the teaching and learning more effective, it is necessary to leverage information technology so that students can access and use knowledge anytime, i.e., it becomes necessary that students are equipped with IT skills.

3. Objectives of the practice

To make the learning interesting, the use of Powerpoint presentations should be increased. Hence, there is a need for skill among students so that they are experts in IT tools.

4. The Practice

It has been made mandatory that every year a contest will be organized in which four students from each department will participate and show their Powerpoint presentations on the theme decided by the coordinating committee. While giving their presentations, the students are asked questions on both IT skills and the theme of the presentation. In order to motivate the students the coordinating committee gives awards and certificates.

5. Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them

6. Impact of the Practice

Most of the students prepare their notes using IT, they can access notes on their mobiles during the free periods. The interaction among students and between faculty and students is round the clock regarding exchange of notes and attending queries.

7. Resources Required

Most of the class rooms need to be the smart class rooms. Student who do not have PC/ Laptop at their home, they are to be provided this facilities in the college IT section in the library.

Best Practice 1

1. Title of the Practice

Visit to Women Police Station

2. The context that required the initiation of the practice

On the request of Police Commissioner, Dr. Hanif Qureshi, IPS it is proposed that college should arrange visits for girl students to the women police station to make them aware of functioning of police departments. It is proposed that 10 groups of 10 girls each should be made and each group should be led by two female faculty members. This has made the girl student very confident and aware of their rights.

3. Objectives of the practice

To make the girl students aware of their rights

4. The Practice

It is very necessary that girl students are confident and aware of their rights and can assert when situations are unfavourable. It has been decided that girls students should visit Women Police stations of the city in groups. A teacher will accompany them to visit women police station. A counselling session is organized within the Police Station. In this session, students are free to interact with the police officers.

5. Obstacles faced if any and strategies adopted to overcome them

To make the visit successful, local women police officers are to be contacted and ensured their availability.

6. Impact of the Practice

Most of the girl students who have visited the police stations are not confident of their rights, they have enrolled themselves for self defence classes within the college campus. They got encouragement to join police force in future to serve the society. They came to understand that if police is approached at right time then there is a solution to every problem. These girls are spreading the message in the localities where they live.

7. Resources Required

Local transportation to the students and resources for arranging seminars in the police stations
